Truancy:

Even if you are 18 years old, truancy rules apply to you.

- A. Every truancy on a non-block day will result in a ZERO for any grade missed, unless it is made up the following day after school (2:45-3:30).
- B. Every truancy on a block day will result in a ZERO for any grade missed, unless it is made up the following 2 days after school (2:45-3:30 for a total of 90 minutes).
- C. Truant work will never be made up any other time than after school.
- D. Being on time is important. If an assignment is due and you are late and unexcused, so is your homework. Late work is only accepted after school.

Excused Absence:

- A. All work must be made up by one day longer than your absence. (This includes any block days that might have occurred). TESTS and QUIZZES cannot be made up after this time. Please pay attention to this policy if you are absent. Block days count, even if you don't have class.
- B. You must see me outside of class to ask questions regarding missed work.

"What did I miss?" is the only question that will not be answered during class time. If you are absent it is your responsibility to find out what you missed. You may need computer access outside of class to make up or complete work, and computers are available for school use throughout WUHS. You may need to see me outside of classtime.
